Parting Words from Outgoing Lodge Chief



Hellow Arrowmen:

With this being our final newsletter of the year, and my final as chief I decided that it would be best to look back on 2023 and our success as a lodge. Kicking off in January, we held our annual lodge banquet at Auletto Caterers. We had over 60 members in attendance along with their families and other guests, and I couldn't think of a better way to kick off the year. In March we held our first LLD single-day event in years, facilitated by section chief Mike Fowler and special guest Eastern Region Chief Matt Carlson.

Attendees said it was outstanding. Just weeks after hosting our LLD we held our first ordeal of the year, and it was a blast. A few months later was my personal favorite event of the year, Section Conclave. Over 50 of our Arrowmen attended (the most since I have been in the lodge) and it was an amazing feeling. Seeing our members interact with other scouts from throughout E17 was truly a sight to behold and I could not have been more proud. Lodge 8 may not have won the conclave cup, but we did win the canoe tug-of-war and placed high in other competitions, something that we had struggled to do in recent years. I'm sure that we'll win even more next year!

Diving into summer, we held our annual Lodge BBQ/Pool Party with our largest turnout in years. With some delicious BBQ cooked by our own Mr. Bill and over 50 hungry scouts to eat it, I can safely say that not one person left hungry. In October, we held our second ordeal weekend of the year at Fall Induction weekend. Typically there isn't as large a turnout in the fall versus the spring but thanks to the hard work of our elections team and officers, over 70 candidates registered. When added to existing membership over 100 scouts were in attendance. I had the responsibility of planning this year's Fall Induction weekend, and after many trials and tribulations, it wound up being one of our most successful events in recent memory. It included an extremely popular costume party along with other Halloween activities.

We hosted Fall Fellowship weekend at Pine Hill in November. Nearly half of the youth scouts in attendance were those inducted just weeks before. We kicked off Saturday morning with a few trainings on various subjects within the OA before breaking off into teams for afternoon fellowship. Our teams competed valiantly in a variety of competitions including kickball, archery, rifle shooting, and gaga ball. Fall Fellowship culminated with the election of our 2024 lodge officers, who will officially take office in January. Knowing next year's officers, I have complete confidence that our lodge is in safe hands. Finally, we held our annual lodge holiday party at Pine Tree Scout Reservation which was the perfect way to cap off 2023. With over 80 Arrowmen in attendance, plenty of food and fun to go around, a limited edition

patch, and a visit from Santa, there was no better way to end the year.

2023 may be ending, but we're still going to be busy to start the new year. On January 14th the E17 Section Leadership Conference will be held at The College Of New Jersey. The annual lodge banquet will be held on January 28th at Auletto Caterers which will include awards, patch trading, and the installation of our spring 2024 Lodge Officers. I look forward to seeing how many people we can get to come out as we celebrate Lenape Lodge's 10th anniversary.

For every Smoke Signals letter that I have sent this year, I have ended it with 'Primus Inter Pares'. This phrase

has a personal meaning to me that is more than meets the eye. It's a Latin phrase that translates to 'First among equals', a principle of servant leadership. Come join Lenape 8's fourth contingent to NOAC 2024 in Boulder Colorado! The National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC) is the flagship national Order of the Arrow event. It is held every vears at а major two university campus and is attended by as many as 8,000 Arrowmen from all 50 states. It is second only to the BSA National Jamboree in size and scope. The cost for participants is \$1,350 and is all-inclusive (transportation, lodging, meals, memorabilia, etc.). At the time ofregistering, a minimum of \$250 per participant is due, and the remaining balance be paid in monthly can installments. Payments can also be made offline through the Scout Office or Scout Shop. Payment in full is due June 1, 2024. All youth/young Scouts are highly adult encouraged to register and Scouters can apply adult online for further review.



The registration period to attend this National conference is coming up quickly...January 31! This is due to planning considerations in arranging flights into and out of Colorado, as well as transportation to and from the University of Colorado in Boulder. This is a HARD DEADLINE; no exceptions. If

you want to attend NOAC this year, you MUST register by January 31. Please use the QR codes which will take you to the Registration website. Adults will apply for attendance and will be notified of their selection. Adults applying are not committed to paying the \$1350 until selected to attend.


